PART IINARRATIVE SUMMARY

The Brigade Logistic Support Group was activated on 19 April 1975 to provide logistic support to 9th Marine Amphibious Brigade (iMB) units during NEIVAC operations in Vietnam. The Group was composed of a headquarters element and three Logistic Support Units (LSU's). Because of the limited operations ashore as visualized in the CONPLAN it was determined that a small, highly specialized command and control headquarters element imposed over the existing LSU's would provide the most effective logistical support organization within the space limitations and time constraints.

The three LSU's had previously been under the operational control of the Battalion Landing Teams (BLT's) or Marine Amphibious Units (MAU's) which they were supporting. Upon change of opcon to the BLSG, they became part of a larger logistical operation.

Under the MAU concept, the material assets of the LSU's were for the sole support of a designated BLT. Under the BLSG concept, the assets, while primarily for the support of the designated BLT, were also available for the support of the entire Landing Force.

Due to the short time frame between the activation and the departure of the BLSG from Okinawa to the flagship, USS BLUE RIDGE, there was not time to obtain a computer record of the assets of LSU's. While it became apparent early in the planning cycle that there were generally sufficient levels of supply within the LSU's and LFORM to support the operation, the problem would be location and availability within the Task Force.

Therefore as soon as the Task Force was assembled in the Evacuation Operation Area (EOA) a meeting of the LSU commanders and the BLSG staff was held aboard the flagship. Records of the material assets of the LSU's were obtained and key extracts were inducted into the Amphibious Support Information System (ASIS) so that a computerized centralized inventory was available. Landing Force Operational Readiness Material (LFORM) held on all the ships of the Task Force was also inducted into ASIS. Technical skills within the LSU's were readily available from Manpower Management System (MMS) listings provided by the LSU commanders.

Based upon the centralized inventory of all supplies available within the Task Force and identification of the maintenance skills, the BLSG through the Logistic Control Center (LCC) assigned specific responsibilities to the LSU's and controlled all movement of resupply actions as well as maintenance support requirements. This was designed to eliminate duplication and make maximum use of supplies and skills at hand.

Due to the nature of the NEIVAC operation, it was decided that the prescribed loads would suffice for the duration of the operation. The prescribed loads were established to cover the maximum period of time

prepared to complete the evacuation; and in the case of the ship's security detachment, to cover the period from loading refugees to the time the ship reached its safe haven. If for any reason the operation extended beyond the projected period of time, safety stocks were assembled and stored to provide an immediate resupply capability.

The three LSU's were assigned primary, secondary and tertiary responsibilities in support of the Landing Force. These assignments were made based on the physical and personnel assets of the LSU's and any contingency plans which they were to support. As a result, the following assignments were made:

The rationale behind the primary assignments were that each LSU had different characteristics by virtue of its prior operations and lengths of time to form and outfit for this operation. LSU 2/4 had been on station in the Gulf of Siam for approximately 45 days involved in support of Eagle Pull and had also been involved in refugee operations at Danang. The supplies had been used and resupply had been difficult due to time and transportation constraints. LSU 3/9 had been flown from Camp Fuji to Okinawa and then loaded on the USS MOBILE. Its maintenance capability was complete but it was short some of its supplies due to operations at Fuji. It had however restocked its supply of batteries during its time on Okinawa. LSU 1/9 had been formed and flown from Okinawa to Subic in less than 48 hours. As a result it took only its operating deployment stocks leaving Mount Out and its maintenance vans behind. What supplies it had were complete and it was generally well staffed with supply personnel. It was embarked on the USS DURHAM, an LKA which had a large quantity of LFOUR. LSU 2/4 was aboard an LSD which would facilitate movement to the beach in support of the Vung Tau operation, should it be required. As it happened LSU 2/4 provided the Helicopter Support Teams (HST) in the DAO compound.

To be ready to support the various options of the operation, safety stocks were assembled by LSU 1/9 and prepositioned on the USS DURHAM. They consisted of two notional company size and one notional battalion size blocks of rations, water, batteries, fuel, medical supplies and ammunition. In addition, two special field fortification packages consisting of concertina and ports were also staged on the USS DURHAM.

Initial resupply and reinforcement support for the operation was envisioned as being minimal since evacuation was directed. The policy was to support the Ground security forces from mobile dumps at sea so as to have as few support personnel ashore as possible.

It was also necessary to equip and support the Amphibious Evacuation Security Force (AESF) detachments which were sent to the various Military Sealift Command (MSC) ships supporting the evacuation of Vietnamese evacuees. Rations, medical supplies, ammunition and other equipment were assembled and distributed to the detachments.

Explosive Ordnance personnel were inserted into the Defense Attaché Office (DAO) compound in Saigon prior to the operation in order to ensure that the various landing zones were prepared for accepting helicopters and also to ensure that sensitive equipment did not fall into hostile hands when the withdrawal/evacuation was executed. Millions of dollars of equipment and structures were to be destroyed just prior to the last helicopter leaving the DAO compound.

When the execute order was received the BLSG had the safety stocks prepared and was ready to provide resupply of any material held in the Landing Force. Due to the fact that the Ground Security Force (GSF) elements were inserted with two days of prescribed loads and the operation was completed in less than 24 hours, there was no requirement for resupply. The BLSG did provide illumination flares to the GSF commander so that the landing zones would have a backup illumination for the HST teams. The EOD team destroyed the equipment and building in the DAO compound.

During the period immediately following the operation, the BLSG was primarily involved with supporting the demands of AESF teams located on the MSC shipping. The supplies required were Class I and V. This type of resupply action continued until ships reached Subic.

The need to gather information concerning expenditures is well known; however the units participating in the operations, particularly, provisional units did not have the necessary equipment and inventory documents against which to assess their losses of Class II or Class VII equipment. Further the need to keep active records of expenditures was not realized; therefore there is a delay in collecting this information. There is a need to clearly define the type and detail of reports operating units must maintain.

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

PART II

On 19 April 1975 LSU 2/4 changed OPON from 31st MAU to BLSC. On 29 April 1975 participated in the evacuation of Americans and South Vietnamese refugees from Saigon during Operation FREQUENT WIND. Maintenance Support Element personnel with augmentation from LSU Headquarters and Supply Support Elements aboard USS THOMASTON were used as internal security and assisted in feeding and processing of personnel received during the operation. An Auto Tech was supplied to Battalion Landing Team 2/4 for the issuance and security of munitions. On 30 April 1975 personnel from Supply Support Element assisted in resupply of LST 218 from the USS VINCER, with LCM's-8 from the USS THOMASTON. These men carried rations and supplies from the LCM-8 up portable ladders to supply refugees and the Taiwan Navy with badly needed rations. In addition, twelve HSI Marines from LSU's Detachment 3d Shore Party Battalion accompanied elements of Battalion Landing Team 2/4 into Saigon where they assisted in LZ control. LSU personnel aboard USS VANCOUVER and USS PEGASUS assisted their respective ship's company in processing and handling evacuees.

- B. Narrative Summary

Five officers, fifty two enlisted Marines, and seven Navy enlisted from LSU 3/9 embarked aboard the USS MOBILE on 17Apr75. USS MOBILE departed White Beach for Subic Bay on 18Apr75. While enroute to Subic Bay, P.I. she was diverted to a holding area off the coast of South Vietnam for possible evacuation of American civilians, third country nationals, and South Vietnamese refugees from the Siegon area. Shortly after the MOBILE left Okinawa, 9th Marine Amphibious Brigade was formed and LSU 3/9 became OPCON to the Brigade Logistic Support Group. The logistics support concept for Operation Frequent Wind was established by the BLSG. All of the assets of LSU 2/4, LSU 3/9 and LSU 1/9 were under the centralized control of the BLSG. LSU 3/9 had primary responsibility to provide maintenance contact teams and secondary responsibilities for supply support, and establishing a Beach Support Area. Additionally, LSU 3/9 was the primary source of batteries and water cans; and as such, staged two company sized blocks, and one battalion size block of each for rapid issue as safety stocks aboard the USS DURHAM.

During Phase I of Operation Frequent Wind, ship's work, security and training for embarked Marines continued as normal. Physical training, troop information classes, essential subjects training, and MOS training were held on a regular basis. Many of the technicians in Maintenance Platoon assisted the ship's company in support of ship's operations. A total of 15 work orders were completed during the reporting period. Permission was received from BLSG to dispatch MT Maintenance contact teams to both USS DENVER and USS DULUTH to perform maintenance on M274 mules belonging to BLT 3/9. However, transportation was not provided and the jobs were not completed. The Maintenance Officer completed a BLT Maintenance Management SOP, and submitted it to the BLT for approval and publication.

In support of Operation Frequent Wind, LSU 3/9 was initially required to transport batteries, water cans, and LForm ammunition to augment LSU 1/9 safety stocks. When the processing of evacuees started, Marines assisted the ship's company in providing search teams, security teams and working parties that assisted in feeding and settling the refugees aboard. Cots and blankets from Marine supplies were made available to make the refugees stay aboard ship more comfortable. When the refugees were transferred to MSC ships Marine security forces were assigned to each boat to assist the handling of the refugees and to maintain order if required.

When departing Camp Fuji, Japan, this LSU was instructed to leave without its heavy vehicles and equipment. This equipment was to be embarked aboard subsequent shipping and join us in our AOA. Some of the vehicles were embarked aboard the USS ANCHORAGE but 14 M35's and 11 M105's remained at Camp Fuji. When the USS ANCHORAGE arrived at White Beach, the amphibious assault bulk fuel system and one M543 wrecker were off loaded to make room for more important cargo. Plans were made by BLT 3/9 and CTF 76 to cross deck vehicles and equipment to other ARG BRAVO ships when the USS ANCHORAGE arrived in the holding area. However, the USS ANCHORAGE did not arrive until Phase II of Operation Frequent Wind had commenced and as a result no cross decking was accomplished.
